#### E. Area's women empowerment as per young adults

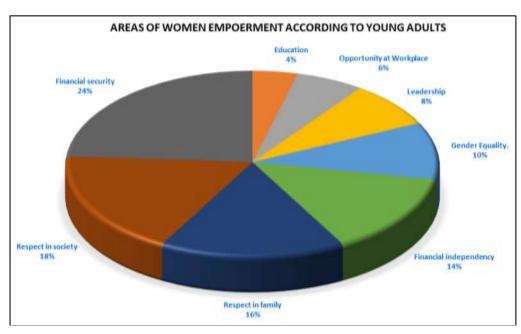


Fig 1: Shows areas of women empowerment as per opinion of young adults
